



## Curriculum Highlights

This week children have continued to work well across the curriculum...

Children in reception have been weighing and studying capacity in maths, reading and sharing The Gingerbread Man story in English and have made magnificent waist coats for their soft toy as part of their Access Art project.

Year one children have been developing their place value understanding of numbers to 20 while year 2 children have been dividing numbers. As part of their Seasons topic the children have focussed on summer. They have examined temperature and general weather patterns as well as the effects of the season on plants and animals.

Children in years 3 & 4 have investigated the impact of the River Nile on the Ancient Egyptians and how important the river was to their civilization.

In years 5 & 6 the children have continued their science work on the circulatory system focusing on the heart, identifying its different parts and their function. We were also delighted to see the Lewis Class assembly where children were able to share examples of work they have enjoyed doing so far this year.
