Nature of support 2014/15

The pupil premium funding has been used to fund a range of initiatives within the school. These have been:

Teaching assistants have been employed to deliver intervention programmes to groups of children and provide support through normal classroom activities.

Funding is available to provide targeted teacher intervention for groups of children in Y6.

Some children receive support in the contribution to the cost of school trips.

Support services from outside agencies may also be bought in by the school.

Where milk is chosen then pupil premium by eligible pupils, funding may be used for this.

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2014/15

The progress made by children has been identified as a key area for development within the school development plan. As part of this development those children in receipt of pupil premium funding are being closely tracked and targeted intervention provided where necessary.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

Impact at the end of 2013/14

Children are tracked for the progress they make each year. The table below summaries the average progress made by children who triggered the pupil premium funding during 2013/14, for that academic year. The figures show the average points score progress for each group of children.
