All 3 / 4 children have accessed swimming lessons this year. Year 6 were all assessed at the start of term 6 and then attended booster sessions if they were not able to swim at least 25m. At the end of the booster sessions ? % of children were able to swim at least 25m which is above the national average of 55% of children in year 6 able to swim 25m unaided when leaving primary school. Children have also been taught water safety as part of the swimming curriculum in a move to incorporate and extend the ability to perform safe self-rescue.
