Using your knowledge from this video can you make a small floating boat using playdough, tinfoil, corks, lolly sticks, sponge etc.

Can you build a pirate ship? What materials might you use? Why? Will it sail? Is it waterproof? Read the Materials Pirate Experiment to find out what to do.

Understanding the World

Find items around the home that you think will float and discuss your reasons why. Test them out either in the bath, washing up bowl, paddling pool etc. Record your findings.

Have a go at the Raison experiment. Have you ever thought about, What makes something float? What makes something sink?

Make a pirate boat out of an old margarine tub, ice cream tub or anything that will be suitable. Work out how much treasure (coins, beads, pasta) you can get on board before it sinks.
